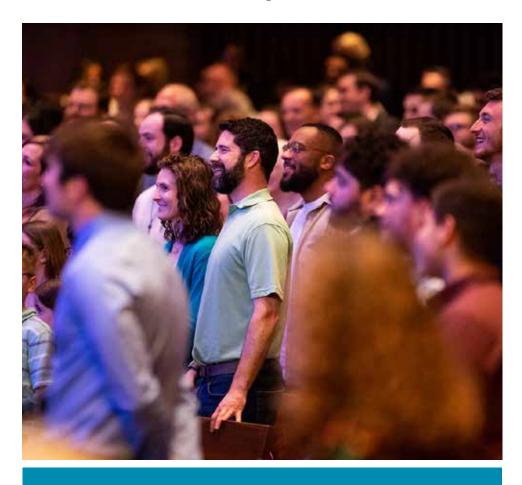
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MINISTRY REPORT The Chapel Fiscal Year 2022-2023

Net	-\$219,333	\$121,073	\$340,406

Through God's above-and-beyond provision, and our church's reduced spending, we brought in \$121,703 more than we spent. This helped us end the year in a financial position that was \$340,406 better than anticipated.

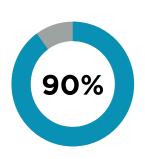

As we step out as an independent church, we are still finding our financial footing. We continue to rightsize our systems, processes, and spending as we anticipate the Lord's provision for what He has in store.

As of December 31, though total revenue was only behind by \$12,327, offering was \$85,479 less than anticipated. Through selective underspending and the natural seasonality of our expenses, we have currently underspent our budget by \$228,734. Though the majority of our fiscal year is ahead of us, we were able to end December with a positive difference of \$216,407.
